"Louisville is more than just an area code to me. It means everything to me. It's the foundation of who I am. I spent all my life fantasizing about being someone that could put the city on a pedestal," says Harlow of his hometown. "It's important to me to keep some positive energy flowing through the city. Things are not easy right now and I feel so privileged to be in the position I'm in. I feel a responsibility to give back and help pave a way for others."

AMPED partners with numerous organizations and AMPED youth are regularly invited to perform at community events.
